# NURSERY

In Nursery, we have continued learning about a range of emotions, texture and 2D shape.

Through the story 'Goldilocks and the three Bears' children have explored emotions such as sad, happy, scared and surprised. Children made their own representations of a range of emotions using, playdough, paint, loose parts and observing their own faces using mirrors. We made a story board to support children in retelling parts of the story using their own words.

Through the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' children had great fun exploring texture. We used lots of language to describe texture such as oozy, squelchy, sticky, slippy and slimy.

In Maths children have been exploring 2D shape. Children have been classifying shape, describing shape, guessing the shape through feeling a mystery shape in a bag. They have also used cameras to capture images of different shapes found in our learning environment.





# YEAR 1

We have been learning about The Tiger Who Came to Tea which is a short children's story written and illustrated by Judith Kerr. The book concerns a girl called Sophie, her mother, and a personified tiger who interrupts their afternoon tea. He eats all of their food and drinks everything including the bath water.

In Year 1, we created our very own Tasty Tiger Menus using many exciting adjectives to enhance our writing.
